The trails at McLain State Park is used for cross-country skiing during the winter and for hiking during the rest of the year. The length of the two trails total about 4 miles.

Hunting is permitted on the park land that is south of M-203 when in season.

Fishing is allowed from the lighthouse pier. A fishing license is required. When Lake Superior is very wavy, you will not want to be on the pier because the waves can crash into and go over the pier.

The wide-shoulder bike route along M-203 to Calumet is approximately 10 miles from the state park entrance to US-41. The shoulder is narrow within the state park boundary. You can ride along M-203 south to Hancock.
